

## **Needle Exchange and Animal Services Programs**

Staff researched needle exchange and animal services programs available within Santa Clara County. Table 1 provides information on the primary needle exchange program serving the county, the Santa Clara County Harm Reduction Program, and Table 2 provides information on animal services programs serving the county area, including shelter and adoption, foster care, spay/neuter, and community cat programs.

<b>General Services &amp; Role</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provides sheltering for domestic and farm animals</li> <li>• Facilitates adoptions</li> <li>• Investigates cruelty and neglect complaints</li> <li>• Reunites lost pets with owners</li> <li>• Oversees animal control in unincorporated areas</li> <li>• Serves unincorporated areas and cities, including Gilroy, Morgan Hill, and Sunnyvale</li> </ul> <b>Main Contact:</b> <b>Address:</b> 12425 Monterey Road, San Martin, CA 95046 <b>Phone:</b> (408) 686-3900 <b>Hours:</b> Mon–Fri 12:00–6:00 pm; Sat–Sun 12:00–5:00 pm
<b>Shelter and Adoption</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Houses animals that are lost, injured, or surrendered (space permitting)</li> <li>• Adoption fees include spay/neuter, microchipping, and vaccinations</li> <li>• Maintains “Lost and Found” listings service</li> <li>• Accepts surrendered pets from unincorporated areas and select cities (Gilroy, Sunnyvale, Morgan Hill), with some intake exceptions</li> </ul>
<b>Foster Care Programs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Offers home-based foster options to reduce shelter stress and support animal well-being</li> </ul>

	<b>Types of Foster:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Long-term foster for adoption-ready animals</li> <li>• Field trips / sleepovers for temporary home experience</li> <li>• Kitten fostering for young kittens needing extra care</li> </ul>
<b>Spay / Neuter and Community Cat (TNR) Programs – County-Run</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Free Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) spay/neuter for community/unowned cats in Gilroy, Morgan Hill, San Martin, Sunnyvale, Stanford, and unincorporated areas</li> <li>• Clinic location: 12425 Monterey Rd, San Martin</li> <li>• Drop-off: 7:30 am on Tuesdays and Thursdays (no appointment; limited space)</li> <li>• Limit: One cat per person/property per day</li> <li>• Only healthy cats accepted; injured/sick cats must go through shelter</li> <li>• Each altered cat is ear-tipped</li> <li>• Eligibility limited to county/unincorporated residents</li> </ul>
<b>Regional and Nonprofit Spay/Neuter Programs</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>San José Animal Care and Services:</b> TNR for cats in San José, Saratoga, Cupertino, Milpitas (2 days/week; post-surgery hold required).</li> <li>• <b>Humane Society Silicon Valley (HSSV):</b> TNR services, vaccinations, parasite treatment, ear-tipping; mobile clinics for cats and small dogs.</li> <li>• <b>SVACA (Silicon Valley Animal Control Authority):</b> Low-cost spay/neuter clinic with rabies vaccine and microchip; voucher programs for low-income residents.</li> <li>• <b>PAWS for SJACS:</b> Nonprofit offering spay/neuter and vaccine support (voucher program currently suspended).</li> <li>• <b>Town Cats:</b> Provides free spay/neuter for feral cats and low-cost services for pets; partners with local shelters for TNR and rescue.</li> </ul>
