#### FEDERAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

#### Valley Water FY26 Federal Funding Requests

As part of the annual budget process, Valley Water has submitted Community Project Funding requests for two priority projects. These awards, also known as Congressionally Directed Spending, are projects selected directly by a Member of Congress and included in a fiscal year's appropriations bill. For FY26, Valley Water has requested \$10M for construction of the Anderson Dam Stage 2 Diversion System and \$4M for design of the San Jose Purified Water Facility. The projects must be selected by a Member of Congress and then accepted by the House or Senate Appropriations Committee before the funds are included in the final appropriations bill. Valley Water submitted similar requests for FY25 and one was selected, but ultimately excluded in the final stages of the appropriations process when Congress opted to enact a Continuing Resolution that did not include these funds.

# AB 269 (Bennett) - Bill Diluting Dam Safety Funding Program Stopped

Valley Water, alongside a coalition of major water agencies across California, was successful in stopping AB 269 (Bennett) in the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. The bill would have expanded the state's Dam Safety and Climate Resilience Local Assistance Program to include funding for dam removals, which is not currently included in the program. While the program was originally created to support critical dam safety projects such as seismic retrofits, spillway repairs, and sediment removal, AB 269 threatened to dilute its focus and divert limited funds away from essential public safety investments.

The coalition emphasized the existence of multiple dedicated funding sources for dam removal projects, while no other state or federal program exists specifically for dam safety. With urgent infrastructure upgrades like the \$2.3 billion Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit Project underway, Valley Water argued that AB 269 would undermine public safety and water supply reliability across the state, putting a stop to this problematic bill.

# LOCAL ADVOCACY AND ENGAGEMENT EFFORTS

#### **Environmentally Focused Stakeholder Meeting**

On April 2, Chair Estremera kicked off the first environmentally focused stakeholders meeting of the year hosted by Valley Water. Chair Estremera greeted a diverse cross-section of environmental leaders at the virtual meeting and introduced Director Ballard, who was also in attendance. Valley Water staff conducted an informational presentation on the Pacheco Reservoir Expansion Project and shared an update on the Desalination Engineering Feasibility Study. Attendees participated in a lively discussion during the meeting, engaged Valley Water directors and staff with questions, and provided valuable feedback on Valley Water projects through an environmental stewardship lens.

#### VIP Water Walk Tour Held on April 11

On April 11, Valley Water hosted a tour of Valley Water's critical water infrastructure in Santa Clara County. Tour guests included elected officials across ten cities, county and special district staff, as well as state and federal representatives and business leaders. The tour served as an opportunity to educate and engage regional stakeholders on the various projects' benefits and to advocate for legislative needs.
