#### **VALLEY WATER NIGHT AT SAN JOSE GIANTS**





#### INTERNAL COMMUNICATIONS

Staff produced a Valley Water Night recap video shared during the August 14 Town Hall, on Aqua and News You Can Use. The video has been viewed 279 times. Throughout August, staff distributed 21 all-user emails. These included the Valley Water Night information, both pre- and post-event, multiple Security Advisories, a donation request from the Benefits and Wellness Program, a heat advisory, parking impacts, and a call to submit photos for the 2026 Valley Water calendar. Staff posted 68

employee news items to the Aqua intranet; updated the Employee News monitors at our water treatment plants, the Sacramento office, in the HQ and Admin cafeterias, and the Crest hallway; and created and sent the twice-weekly News You Can Use each Tuesday and Thursday.

#### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

On Aug. 27, Valley Water hosted a virtual public meeting on the Stream Maintenance Program Draft Environmental Impact Report. Director Hsueh offered opening remarks, and seven community members participated. Valley Water staff from units that support the Stream Maintenance Program were available to address questions about our creek work.

On Aug. 21, Valley Water held a hybrid preconstruction meeting for the Palo Alto Flood Basin Tide Gate Seismic Retrofit and Rehabilitation Project at the Mitchell Park Community Center and via Zoom. Director Hsueh provided opening remarks to a combined audience of 30 participants, including Vice Chair Santos, Director Eisenberg and staff from the cities of Palo Alto and Mountain View.

On Aug. 12, staff delivered a Speakers Bureau presentation to the Los Altos Kiwanis Club, which drew 15 attendees.
