## Office of Government Relations Legislative Update



### FEDERAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

#### Pacheco Project Recommended for Federal Funding

In June, the U.S. Department of the Interior recommended that the San Luis Low Point Improvement Project (SLLPIP) receive \$1.7 million in Fiscal Year 2019 funding under the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act to complete the project feasibility study. The recommendation specifically names the Pacheco Reservoir Expansion Project as the preferred alternative under the SLLPIP, and it is one of 10 projects recommended for funding. To adopt these recommendations, Congress must name these projects in annual appropriations legislation. While it remains unclear when Congress will pass the next regular appropriations legislation, having the Pacheco Project listed (via the SLLPIP) is a critical first step toward ensuring that the project receives federal funding in this and future years. Staff has advocated for several years to have Pacheco included on Interior's list of projects to be recommended for funding, and this is a huge win for the agency. Staff will continue to work closely with our congressional delegation to ensure that the project is awarded funding, and we will also work to advance the Pacheco Project as an independent project in order to maximize the chances of securing funding.



#### House-Passed Infrastructure Package Would Support Pacheco Project

The House of Representatives on July 1 passed a \$1.5 trillion infrastructure package that includes several water storage provisions, including language proposed by Valley Water staff that would support development of the Pacheco Reservoir Expansion Project. The bill would protect the WIIN Act approval process for storage projects already moving through the approval process, such as the Pacheco Project, and it would remove statutory language that could pose a barrier to federal construction funding for the project. Staff will continue to work closely with congressional staff to ensure that the language advances in the Senate and in any final legislation.

### STATE ADVOCACY EFFORTS



#### Assembly Passes Bill to Expedite the Anderson Dam Project

AB 3005 (R. Rivas), Valley Water's sponsored bill to expedite the Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit Project, is expected to be heard in the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee in late July or early August. The bill has garnered bipartisan support in an Assembly and we expect similar support in the Senate.

In June, staff successfully negotiated with the State Water Resources Control Board and the California Department of Fish & Wildlife provision that will expedite permitting for the Anderson Project. Staff is currently working with key legislative committees in the Assembly and Senate to restore

provisions that would expedite judicial review of challenges to the project's compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). AB 3005 will help Valley Water deliver the public safety, water supply, and environmental benefits of the Anderson Project sooner.

## COVID-19 Closes the State Capitol

As Following the convening of the Legislature in June to pass the annual state budget, several legislators and staff have reported testing positive for COVID-19, and one Assemblymember has

been hospitalized. Both the Assembly and Senate announced that the State Capitol was closed for deep cleaning and both houses have delayed their returns from summer recess by at least two weeks. Legislators are expected to return on July 27, but that date may be delayed further.

Legislative deadlines have become uncertain as the constitutional mandated adjournment on August 31 rapidly approaches. The delayed reconvening of the Legislature means AB 3005 and other critical legislation will have less time to win passage to the Governor.

## LOCAL ADVOCACY AND ENGAGEMENT EFFORTS

### Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit Project to the South County Realtors Alliance

On June 24, Director John Varela provided the South County Realtors Alliance an overview of the Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit Project. This well attended virtual meeting brought many questions and helped facilitate the Alliance's understanding of the project and its current status.

### Safe, Clean Water Presentation to the South Bay Labor Council

On June 15, Vice-Chair Tony Estremera and Director Richard Santos provided opening remarks during the Office of Government Relations' (OGR) Safe Clean Water & Natural Flood Protection Program presentation to the South Bay Labor Council. In the last month, OGR has successfully galvanized local support for the program renewal from a diverse coalition of cities, business leaders, labor groups, environmental organizations, open space advocates, faith-based groups, schools as well as state and local elected officials.
