FEDERAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

On August 6, Vice Chair Santos, Director Ballard, and several staff met with Lt. Col. Virginia R. Brickner (recently appointed Commander of the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) San Francisco District) along with other partner organizations and federal regulatory agencies for a site tour of the Sunnyvale, Shoreline, and Upper Guadalupe River Flood Protection projects. This tour provided an invaluable opportunity to introduce Lt. Col. Brickner to our regional priorities and shared project goals, showcase the critical features, progress, and benefits of each project, and reinforce the importance of strong federal partnership and support in advancing flood protection, ecosystem restoration, and community resilience. Lt. Col. Brickner demonstrated strong engagement and interest throughout the tour, underscoring her commitment to collaborative progress.



Joint Special Meeting with the San Jose City Council


On August 19, the Board of Directors held a joint special meeting with the San Jose City Council at San Jose City Hall. Valley Water and City of San Jose staff jointly presented informational updates on the Purified Water, Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit and Covote Creek Flood Protection projects, and Valley Water's Safe, Clean Water and Natural Flood Protection Program. All status reports were unanimously accepted by both the Board and City Council. Key discussions focused on accelerating project timelines, managing encampments, addressing housing needs, intergovernmental coordination, and maximizing purified water capacity. Valley Water has a long history of collaboration with San Jose, and the special meeting provided an opportunity to continue the agency's partnership with the City. The Board and City Council discussed ways to work together on issues important to the community and reaffirmed their commitment to ongoing partnership and collaboration.

Environmentally Focused Stakeholder Meeting

On August 13, Chair Estremera kicked off the second environmentally focused stakeholders meeting of the year hosted by Valley Water. Chair Estremera greeted a diverse cross-section of environmental leaders at the virtual meeting and introduced Director Ballard. Valley Water staff provided an update on Direct Potable Reuse efforts, followed by an informational presentation on redwood forest restoration research. Attendees participated in a lively discussion during the meeting, engaged Valley Water directors and staff with questions, and provided valuable feedback on Valley Water projects through an environmental stewardship lens.

Vice Chair Santos welcomed the group at SVAPWC and Valley Water staff provided a presentation on purified water before leading the Councilmember and her staff on a walking tour of the facility. Councilmember Campos and the District 2 team were able to see firsthand the purification processes, ask questions about water reuse and its benefits, and sample the bottled purified water.
