




# **Early and Proactive Drought Response**



# **Countywide Water Savings**




The percent increase (+) or percent decrease (-) in water use from 2019 to 2022 is shown for each month.



- Goal to reach 15% call on annual cumulative basis
- Valley Water's savings exceed State's, but we still need to do more
- Water use reduction enforcement plan will help increase water savings

#### **Revised Scenarios with no Conservation or Transfers**\*


Risk of subsidence and dry wells if critically dry conditions continue in 2023. Water use must be reduced to ensure sufficient supplies.

<sup>\*2022</sup> and 2023 scenarios assume demand reduced by 0% from 2019. Achieving the 15% call in 2022 and 2023 would increase groundwater storage by about 39 TAF.

# **Authority to Enforce**

- In 2015, public water agencies were first authorized for water waste-related fines through
   SB 88
- Consistent with Article X, Section 2 of the California Constitution, and pursuant to authority under Water Code §350 et. seq and §375 et. seq, Santa Clara Valley Water District Act
- Consistent with Water Shortage Emergency Condition declared by the Board in June 2021

# **Purpose for Ordinance**

- By reason of water shortage emergency condition, avoid depleting the water supply needed for human consumption, sanitation, and fire protection
- Reduce risk of local land subsidence
- Reduce discretionary water use (irrigation)
- Reduce water use countywide by avoiding water waste, in a manner that is fair and equitable

# **Findings of Necessity**

- Persistent and severe drought
- Meet at least 80 percent of demand during drought
- State Executive Order N-7-22 for Drought Emergency
- Low local supplies, Anderson Reservoir unavailable, Coyote Reservoir storage limited
- Half of home water use may be irrigation, which increases in summer
- Despite Valley Water's aggressive actions, no savings during first 3 months of 2022

The ordinance is needed as soon as possible to save water during summer.

#### **Ordinance for Board Consideration**

- Educational process culminating in fines for uncorrected violations
- Fines up to \$10,000
- Irrigation restrictions in amended Resolution 22-20
  - 2 days per week for non-functional turf
  - No runoff, midday watering, or irrigation after rainfall (all landscapes)
- Potential State ban on watering CII lawn may be included in the future
- Focused on Valley Water potable supplies (treated water and groundwater)

Notice of Violation with escalating fines up to \$10,000 per violation

#### **Collaboration with Retailers**

- Consistent drought coordination since June 2021 Resolution 21-68
- Valley Water will complement retailers' existing enforcement programs
- No duplication of fines
- Focus of the proposed ordinance is on enforcement of water waste prohibitions rather than percent reduction in use
- Retailers may have additional tools to discourage water waste such as tiered pricing

# **Next Steps**

- Publish ordinance in newspaper
- Continue retailer coordination
- Ordinance in effect June 1, 2022
- Enforcement updates in Monthly Drought Reports
- Budget adjustment if needed
- Expanded public outreach

#### Recommendation

Recommendation by Water Conservation and Demand Management Committee:

Adopt the Ordinance "Adopting drought outdoor water conservation and enforcement measures."
