
Pacheco Reservoir Expansion, Single Source Consultant Agreement

Recommendation

- Discuss February 23, 2017 meeting of the Pacheco Reservoir Exploratory Ad Hoc Committee
- Authorize the Interim CEO to execute a single source consultant agreement with Stantec to prepare a Prop 1 funding application for Pacheco Reservoir expansion.
- Approve a budget adjustment of \$1 million from the General Fund Reserve to support consultant services and staff hours.

Pacheco Reservoir Exploratory Ad Hoc (Pacheco Ad Hoc) Committee meeting (February 23, 2017)

- Pacheco Ad Hoc Committee met with directors from Pacheco Pass Water District and San Benito County Water District
- Topics of discussion:
 - Potential enlargement of Pacheco Reservoir and possible pursuit of Proposition 1 funding.
 - Partnership among PPWD, SBCWD, SCVWD
 - Draft principles of agreement


Stantec Contract Summary

- Contract divided into two phases.
- Phase 1: Go/No go assessment
- Phase 2: If go, develop application documents.
- Contract may be terminated at any time.
- ❖ Total estimated cost up to \$900,000
 - Phase 1 approx. \$200,000
 - Phase 2 approx. \$550,000
 - Post application follow-up approx. \$150,000

Scope of Work

- Task 1 Project Management and External Agency Support
- Task 2 Develop Preliminary Feasible Alternatives (for Go/ No-go decision)
- Task 3 Prepare Application for WSIP (Technical Studies, Preliminary Operations Plan and Project Schedule)
- Task 4 Supplemental Services (Respond to change in Regulations or Post Application Support)

Potential Benefits of Pacheco Reservoir Expansion

- Drought year and emergency supply
- Increased operational flexibility = improved water supply reliability and quality
- Improved resiliency to climate change
- Delta ecosystem enhancement
- Improved steelhead run on Pacheco Creek

Challenges and Issues

- High capital cost: 130 TAF Pacheco Reservoir at roughly \$800 million
- Proposition 1 funding criteria: Expected benefits must exceed expected costs; ecosystem improvements must provide for at least half of funding.
- Partners: Pacheco Pass Water District (owns Pacheco Reservoir); San Benito County Water District (potential partner); possibly others.
- Water Master Plan update: Staff is still analyzing a range of projects in the 2017 Water Supply Master Plan update.
- Limited time: Prop 1 applications due late July/early August 2017.

Prop 1 funding – key requirements

- Balance of water supply and ecosystem benefits driven by Prop 1 funding.
- District must enter into a contract with each appropriate State agency to administer public benefits of the project that includes:
 - Adaptive management plan required with trigger levels that initiate adaptive management actions
 - State agency decision making process
 - Funding sources and financial commitments for adaptive management
 - Reporting requirements
 - Assurances to be determined by State agency and District regarding operations and maintenance.

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
