# SPECIAL JOINT MEETING TUESDAY, AUGUST 21, 2018 6:00 PM

## 1. CALL TO ORDER:

A Special Joint Meeting of the Santa Clara Valley Water District Board of Directors, and the City of Gilroy and City of Morgan Hill City Councils, was called to order in the District Headquarters Building Boardroom, at 5700 Almaden Expressway, San Jose, California, at 6:00 p.m.

### 2. SPECIAL JOINT SESSION:

District Chairperson Santos, Gilroy Mayor Velasco, and Morgan Hill Mayor Tate, offered brief opening comments.

District Director LeZotte arrived.

2.1. Overview of the District's Water Infrastructure, Current/Future Water Supply Planning, Capital Improvement Program, and Morgan Hill/South County Flood Protection Projects.

District Director Varela requested that the materials contained in Attachment 1 be taken out of order to allow presentation on the Pacheco Reservoir Expansion Project (Pacheco Project) to be heard first; and acknowledged receipt of the attached written comments from Mr. Valentin Lopez, Amah Mutsun Tribal Band, identified as Handout 2.1-A herein.

Copies of the Handout were distributed to the Board and Councils, and made available to the public.

Ms. Norma Camacho, Chief Executive Officer, reviewed the information on this item per the attached Board Agenda Memo; and Mr. Chris Hakes, Assistant Officer, reviewed the Pacheco Project presentation materials contained in Attachment 1, Slides 21 through 23.

District Chairperson Santos declared time open for public comments.
