Summary of March 2018 Office of Civic Engagement activities



Board Advisory Youth Commission

In January, Civic Engagement staff began outreach efforts for the District's first Board Advisory Youth



Commission. Staff reached over 160,000 students via social media, blogs, newsletters, and several distribution lists. Staff also passed out flyers to students and faculty at the schools and posted flyers at local hangouts. Staff worked with several youthfocused community based organizations to spread the word

about the commission. Application period was from January 29 – March 2. A total of 118 applications were received and Board Members are in the process of selecting their appointments to the 21-member youth commission.



and tour docents for the water
education and recycled water
programs, including outreach
materials.

In collaboration with Creek Stewardship, a new Volunteer Management System was secured to build out database of

volunteers, which can also be used to host tour event registration for the Silicon Valley Advanced Water Purification Center




Education Outreach

The education outreach team reached a total of 5,562 students through classroom visits and tours, including a Bay Works Career Fair and other events. Staff also reached 100 VTA employees during a lunchtime World Water Day event on March 22 and provided educational activities for the district's Teacher Externship program to seven high school teachers.

Education staff also conducted a youth flood awareness elementary school contest: "Are You Flood Ready?" Coloring Contest, as part of the part of our participation in the National Flood Insurance Program Community Rating System (CRS). The


contest closed on March 16. A total of 149 packets were handed out during class presentations or

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mailed to classrooms between November and March with 37 packets/ classes entering into the contest (24% entry rate based on class numbers). The Board of

Directors will present prizes to the final winners this later this spring at an upcoming board meeting.



Recycled Water Outreach Activities



The water district received a Silicon Valley Conservation Award in the Education category for our recycled water and purified outreach efforts at the Silicon Valley Advanced Purification Center. The 10-year anniversary gala and award celebration was held on World Water Day, March 22 in Palo Alto.
