Asian coronavirus outbreak

Coronaviruses are a family of viruses common in animals, with the newest deadly strain (Novel Coronavirus) identified in Wuhan, China. Now there are reports of the virus in nearly a dozen countries including the U.S.

Coronaviruses are zoonotic, meaning they are transmitted between animals and people.

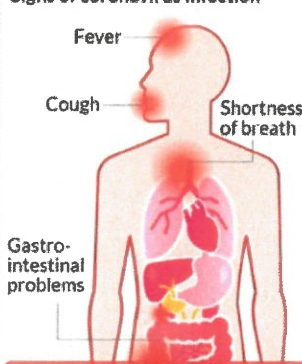


Human-to-human transmission: Coronaviruses are most commonly spread from an infected person by:

- Coughing and sneezing.
- Close personal contact, such as touching or shaking hands.
- Touching an object or surface with the virus on it, and then touching your mouth, nose, or eyes before washing your hands.
- Fecal contamination.

Incident Summary

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is closely monitoring an outbreak caused by a novel (new) coronavirus in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China. On 01/26/20, the California Department of Public Health confirmed that one individual in Los Angeles County and one individual in Orange County tested positive for novel coronavirus 2019 (nCoV-2019). Around 240 US citizens will arrive at Ontario Airport in San Bernardino County as early as Tuesday, 01/28/20, where they will need sheltering and medical support while they are placed under quarantine.
