FEDERAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

FY2021 President's Budget and USACE FY2020 Work Plan Include Funding for Valley Water Projects

On February 10, the Trump Administration released the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 President's Budget, which outlines the President's priorities for the coming fiscal year. The Budget includes \$400,000 to continue the South San Francisco Bay Shoreline Feasibility Study (Phase II). While the President's Budget is a statement of priorities and it will be up to Congress to provide the funding, USACE projects named in the budget are usually automatically included in the work plan that follows enacted appropriations bills. The USACE FY 2020 work plan also includes \$600,000 to continue the feasibility study. These are important successes for Valley Water, highlighting the continued federal interest in moving this project forward.

Also included in the FY 2020 work plan is \$1.5 million to initiate and complete a General Reevaluation Report (GRR) for the Upper Guadalupe River Flood Protection Project. This will allow



USACE to reevaluate the project, including looking at the benefitto-cost ratio of different reaches, in order to determine the federal interest. In short, this allows Valley Water to continue to move this project forward with federal support. The project last received federal funding in FY 2014.

We still have work to do to finalize this support for our projects, and we will continue to advocate for all Valley Water projects and priorities throughout the FY 2021 appropriations process.



STATE ADVOCACY EFFORTS

Valley Water's Anderson Dam Bill Introduced

On February 21, California Assembly Member Robert Rivas (D-Hollister) introduced a bill to expedite the Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit Project (ADSRP). AB 3005 (R. Rivas), The Expedited Dam Safety for Silicon Valley Act, has three primary components.

- 1) Expert Construction Authorizes "best value" selection of the ADSRP construction contractor and ensures a skilled workforce for the project.
- 2) Timely Court Decisions Provides expedited judicial review of challenges to environmental documents issued in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act.
- 3) Faster Permitting Requires expedited processing of state permits by the Department of Fish and Wildlife and the State Water Resources Control Board.

AB 3005 includes an urgency clause that would allow the bill to take effect immediately upon the signature of the Governor. The first policy committee hearings on the bill are expected in March or April. The Office of Government Relations' state and local teams are recruiting broad support for this important legislation that will help speed the start of construction for the project to deliver its critical seismic safety, flood protection, and water supply benefits.

California Water Resilience Portfolio

On January 3, the Newsom Administration released the draft Water Resilience Portfolio (Portfolio) that establishes water policy priorities for state agencies, including the Natural Resources Agency, the Environmental Protection Agency, the Department of Water Resources, and the Department of Food and Agriculture. The purpose is to refocus state efforts to prepare for climate change impacts to our water supply and ecosystems. The draft Portfolio proposes more than a hundred goals and actions for state implementation.

On February 7, Valley Water submitted a comment letter on the draft Portfolio suggesting changes to several key actions to ensure that the water rights process and requirements to reduce reliance on the Delta are clarified to align with current law. Valley Water also acknowledged the inclusion of several items of interest to Valley Water, including water conservation, water reuse, groundwater recharge, expansion of surface

storage, Integrated Regional Water Management, regional water conveyance, and a recommendation to review and streamline environmental permitting processes. We expect to see a final draft of the Portfolio in the next several months. Once the Portfolio is finalized by the Administration, staff will advocate for implementation of actions in Valley Water's interest through state regulatory, legislative, and policy changes.

LOCAL ADVOCACY AND ENGAGEMENT EFFORTS

Los Gatos Mayor and Assistant Town Manager Meeting

On January 15, Director Gary Kremen and Valley Water staff met with Los Gatos Mayor Marcia Jensen and Assistant Town Manager Arn Andrews to discuss several Valley Water projects and programs. Staff provided information and updates on the Winter Preparedness Program, Rinconada Treatment Plant Project, Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit Project, Pacheco Reservoir Expansion Project, and the Safe, Clean Water Grant and Partnership programs.

Valley Water is working with municipalities in the county, including the Town of Los Gatos, to implement the Model Water

Efficient for New Development Ordinance and streamline the hazardous tree removal program in addition to gaining their support for priority legislation and federal and state funding requests.

Valley Water Joins Guadalupe-Coyote Resource Conservation District Tours of Guadalupe Watershed

The Guadalupe-Coyote Resource Conservation District (GCRCD) organized two tours in January of different sites in the Guadalupe Watershed. Director Barbara Keegan joined Valley Water staff at the January 10 tour, which visited the Alamitos Fish Ladder and different reaches of the Guadalupe River. Staff joined the January 31 tour that focused on the Coyote Creek and included stops at the Singleton Road Fish Passage, Anderson Dam and Metcalf Ponds. The tours were intended to educate the GCRCD Board as well as the members of the public.

South Valley Science and Engineering Fair

On February 8, Valley Water hosted a booth at the South Valley Science and Engineering Fair in Morgan Hill. Staff greeted community members and provided informational booklets, coloring books, and flood preparedness kits to families and children.
