





During the December 10 board meeting, Valley Water's Board of Directors gave the green light to staff to explore opportunities to enhance and update the existing Safe, Clean Water and Natural Flood Protection Program (Safe, Clean Water) through a potential renewal of a future funding measure.

An agency-wide Steering Committee and effort has been launched to find out what is important to our residents in terms of priorities. This includes working with internal Safe, Clean Water project staff, key stakeholders, community members, residents and employees to develop a draft Community-Preferred Plan that will be presented to the Board later this summer for their final consideration.

During the next few months, we will be exploring whether to go forward with a November 2020 ballot measure which

would extend funding for Safe, Clean Water beyond the current sunset date of 2028, without increasing the existing tax rate structure.

In November 2012 the voters of Santa Clara County overwhelmingly approved Measure B, the Safe, Clean Water and Natural Flood Protection Program, as a countywide special parcel tax for 15 years with a sunset date of June 30, 2028. The program was developed through community collaboration and input from residents and stakeholders that identified five top community priorities: Ensuring a Safe, Reliable Water Supply; Reducing Toxins, Hazards, and Contaminants from our Waterways; Protecting our Water Supply from Earthquakes and Natural Disasters; Restoring Wildlife Habitat and Providing



Open Space; and Providing Flood Protection to Homes, Business, Schools and Highways.

The Safe, Clean Water renewal team will be holding a series of upcoming brown-bag lunchtime presentations where you can learn about the proposal and how to get involved. Your participation in the development of our new priorities and subsequent sharing of information with your communities and social networks, will be crucial to developing the program.


