Employee Spotlight Stories





The work of Valley Water employees during the COVID-19 crisis is highlighted through a new series that is shared on the Valley Water News blog and our social media channels.

Staff launched a series of Spotlight Stories highlighting the work Valley Water employees are continuing to do during the COVID-19 public health crisis. Beginning April 13, Valley Water has spotlighted one Valley Water employee every week on the Valley Water News blog and through our social media platforms. The series will continue throughout the stay-at-home order issued by the county and state. Staff is writing about employees across different divisions who continue to serve the community during this emergency. Staff has reached out to employees at the water treatment plants, water quality lab, the stream maintenance team, Winfield warehouse and Milpitas Pipeline team, as well as hydrologists and biologists, among others, to gather a diverse group of profiles.
