FEDERAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

Valley Water Working to Advance Infrastructure Priorities

As Congress contemplates its next move to stimulate the national economy, staff is working closely with congressional offices and stakeholder partners to advocate for Valley Water infrastructure priorities.

There is a lot of discussion about the next stimulus package, if there is to be one, and whether that could include infrastructure. Staff has compiled a list of projects that could break ground anywhere from immediately to 18 months from now and create thousands of new jobs in our region, which will help inform our advocacy with congressional offices and committees. While the stimulus discussions continue, Congress is moving forward with a package of water infrastructure bills that could present significant opportunities to advance Valley Water projects and



priorities. The Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works on May 6 reported two water resources bills, and the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure is currently working on its Water Resources Development Act. As these bills advance, along with any future stimulus packages, staff will continue to advocate for Valley Water interests.



STATE ADVOCACY EFFORTS

State Bill to Expedite Anderson Passes Key Policy Committee

On May 14, AB 3005 (R. Rivas), Valley Water's sponsored bill to expedite the Anderson Dam project, passed the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee in a unanimous, bipartisan vote of 14-0. Mayor Rich Constantine of Morgan Hill and Valley Water staff spoke as witnesses in support of the bill. The Office of Government Relations (OGR), in collaboration with the author's office, organized Zoom meetings with the Committee's members' offices in

the days leading up to the hearing to advocacy for and discuss the urgency of the bill.

AB 3005 is supported by local governments and membership groups such as the Association of California Water Agencies and California Municipal Utilities Association, along with labor, environmental, and business organizations. The bill now goes to the Assembly Appropriations Committee for a hearing in early June, and if passed, then goes to the Assembly Floor where a 2/3 vote is required. OGR is vigorously advocating with Assembly members and their staff about the urgency of the Anderson Dam Project for public safety, water supply, and environmental protection.

State Senate Releases Economic Stimulus Plan

On May 12, Senate President Pro Tempore Toni Atkins released the Senate's plan to address the expected multi-year budget shortfall, estimated to be \$54 billion for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. The plan proposes to appropriate \$41.2 billion through reserves, spending reductions, fund shifts, internal loans, and deferrals. In addition, the plan accounts for \$53.6 billion in federal support solutions. Of



particular interest is the inclusion of a \$25 billion Economic Recovery Fund (ERF) which would establish a voluntary program for taxpayers to pre-pay taxes for tax years 2024 to 2033. The ERF would in turn make funding available for programs and projects to provide assistance and economic stimulus. Funding would be made available for rental assistance, small business, infrastructure projects, green economy investments, wildfire prevention education, and local government relief. OGR staff is closely monitoring the budget and is advocating for the inclusion of critical public infrastructure projects and small business funding as the budget is being developed.



LOCAL ADVOCACY AND ENGAGEMENT EFFORTS

Gilroy Chamber of Commerce Hosts Virtual Legislative Summit

On Monday April 20, Director John Varela participated in Gilroy Chamber of Commerce's first virtual Legislative Summit. Speaking via Zoom with Gilroy Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Mark Turner, Director Varela outlined the reliability and safety measures Valley Water has implemented in response of COVID-19 pandemic, to ensure that we continue to provide safe, clean and reliable drinking water to the region. Director Varela also provided an update to Chamber members on the Anderson Dam Seismic Retrofit Project and noted the progress that Valley Water's sponsored legislation AB 3005 is making as it moves through the legislative process.
