

## Stream Maintenance Report August 22 – September 4,2020

#### **Projects and Permit Process Status**

The 2020 Stream Maintenance Program Notice of Proposed Work (NPW1) was submitted for regulatory agency review on April 15th, 2020. Approvals for all projects included in NPW1 have been received from the US Army Corp of Engineers (including consultation with National Marine Fisheries Service), San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), and California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDF&W). Approvals for several projects within BCDC jurisdiction are pending renewal of the SMP programmatic permit. It is anticipated that the BCDC permit will be issued by September 11th, 2020. Valley Water staff are working closely with BCDC staff to resolve the remaining permitting issues.

A second Notice of Proposed Work (NPW2) was submitted for regulatory agency review on June 2nd, 2020. Approvals for all projects included in NPW2 have been received from the US Army Corp of Engineers, both RWQCBs, and from CDF&W.



## Safe Clean Water Priority D1: Management of Revegetation Projects Mitigation Site Maintenance




This Safe Clean Water (SCW) project supports District maintenance of at least 300 acres of existing revegetation projects throughout the five watersheds and provides for maintenance of future revegetation sites.

### Safe Clean Water Priority E.1.1: Vegetation Control for Capacity

Aquatic Herbicide Application, Vegetation Removal < 6' dbh, Tree Removal 6–12" dbh, Limb Removal > 4" dbh



This SCW project supports the District's ongoing instream vegetation removal activities for flow conveyance.


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### Safe Clean Water Priority E.1.4: Vegetation Management for Access

Access Pruning, Weed Abatement, Upland Herbicide Application



This SCW project supports the District's ongoing upland vegetation control activities for fire code compliance and maintaining access for personnel and equipment.
