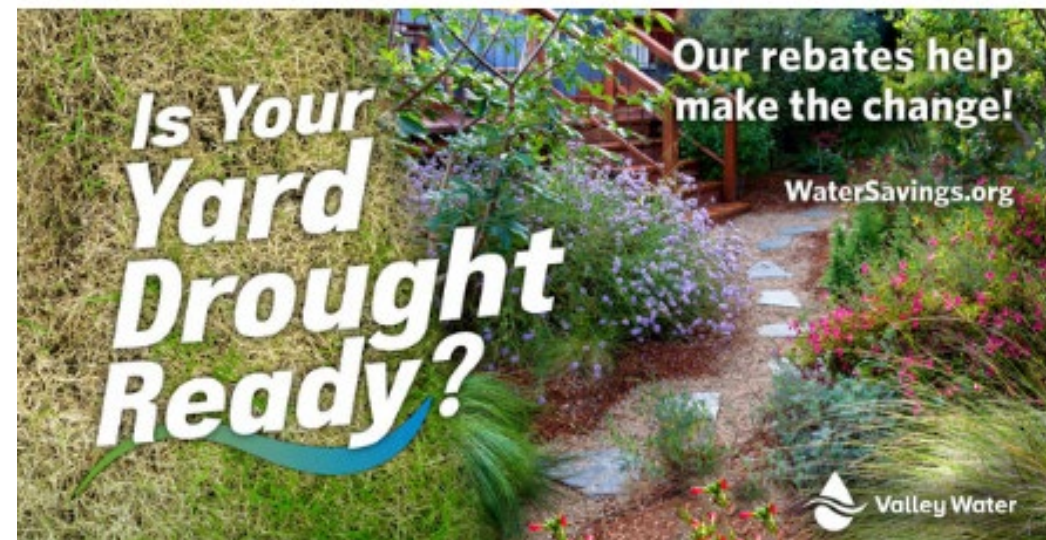

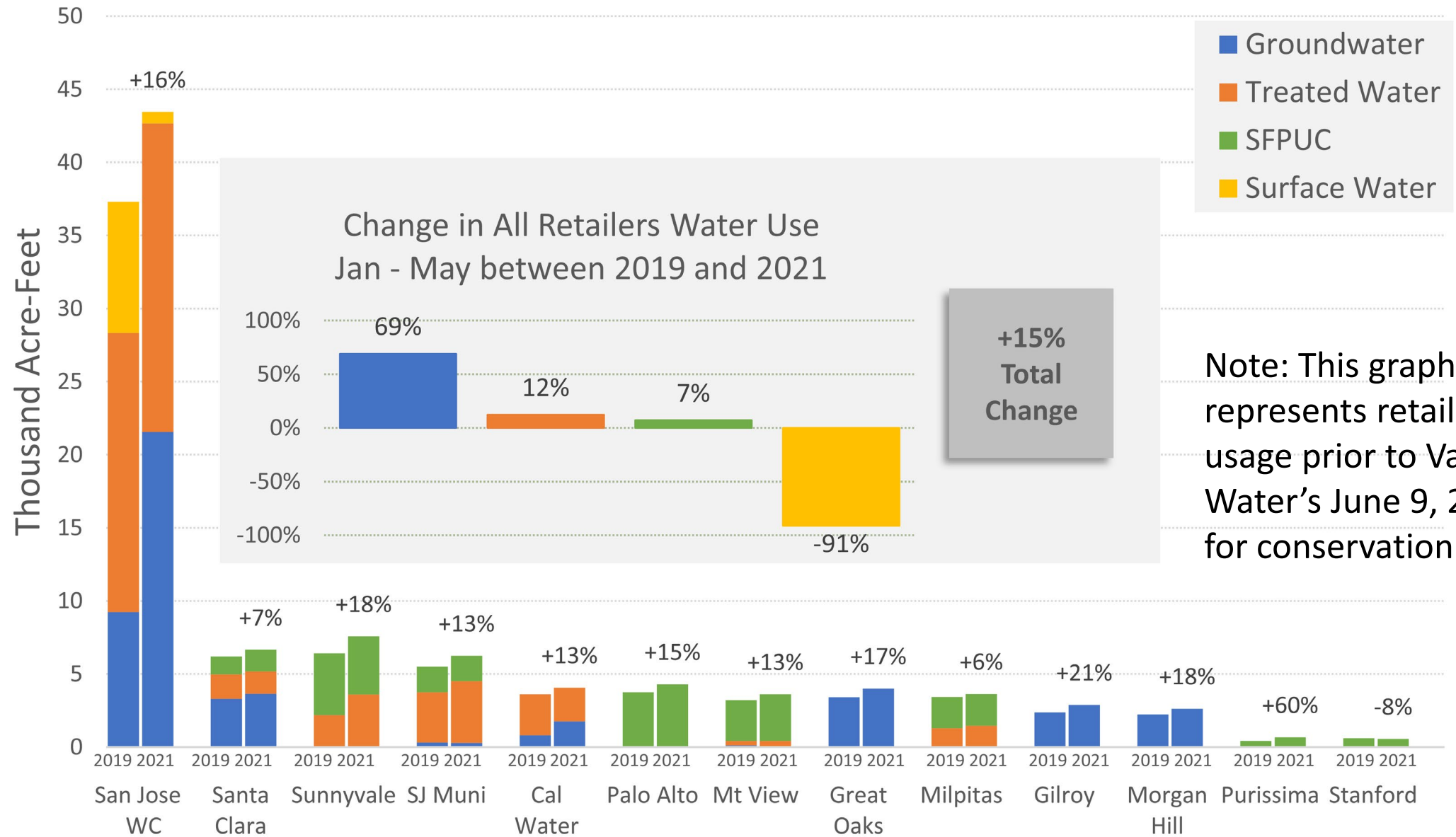

Drought and Conservation Public Outreach

Total Water Use Through May



Imported Water

State Water Project: 5% (5 TAF 2021)

Central Valley Project: (~43 TAF 2021)

0% Agriculture

25% Municipal & Industrial (after June 1)*

*Plus credits for deliveries prior to June 1

- Four water transfers were approved in June (24,350 AF)
- To date in 2021, staff has secured agreements for 59 TAF of transfer supplies, before taking into account conveyance losses.

Groundwater Conditions and Recharge



Groundwater Conditions

Groundwater levels, storage continue to decline.

Risk of subsidence, wells going dry in 2022 without emergency imported water supplies, additional conservation.

Managed Recharge - Scaled back due to reduced allocations

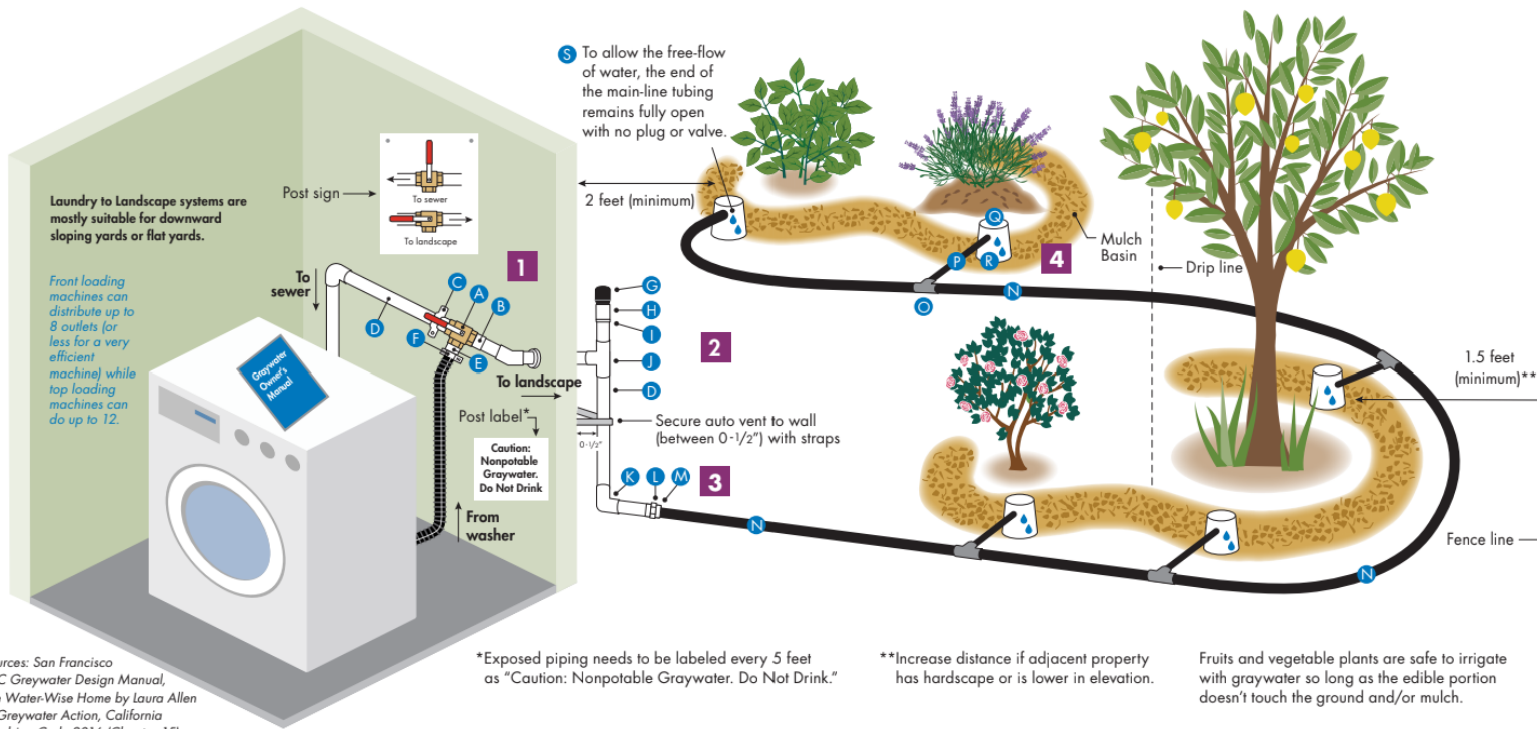
